Assessment for Parents



Purpose of a Summary Report

Besides communicating academic levels of achievement (products), report cards also communicate achievement about a child's progress, social development, and his/her work and study habits.

Academic Achievement (Products)

Academic achievement refers to a student's performance on a specific outcome or goal established by Alberta Education for each subject, at each grade level. For example, a Grade Two mathematics learner outcome states that "Add and subtract numbers within 100". A similar Grade Four mathematics learner outcome specifies that "Add and subtract numbers within 10,000 including decimal numbers, using standard procedures". While all learner outcomes in the Alberta Programs of Study must be taught, your child's teacher will select the key learner outcomes to be reported on for each of the reporting periods. They will also indicate the level of achievement your child has reached at that point in time.

Comments (Progress)

The comment section of the report card will communicate further information about student strengths, areas for growth, and suggestions for improvement. This is where a teacher can provide more individual and specific feedback about a child's learning.

Learner Skills (Process, Social Development, Work and Study Habits)

A child's academic success is directly related to their social development (being able to accept responsibility, work effectively with others, show respect for others and themselves) as well as their work and study habits (listening attentively, being organized, and completing assignments). As such, Learner Skills are reported to parents to indicate their child's progress over the reporting term.

Suggestions for parents/guardians to support their child in this area:

Read through your child's summary report with them. Praise them for the positive aspects and set one or two goals they could try to reach by the next reporting period.
